
Luke 19:37-40

"The Presence of Christ"



37 As Jesus approached the road leading down from the Mount of Olives, the whole throng of his disciples began rejoicing. They praised God with a loud voice because of all the mighty things they had seen.

- 1. Scripture memories, life stories, and meeting Jesus the Christ created a sense of wonder, inquisitiveness, and hope in the people who lived near.
- 2. Humble interaction, gentle words, and an accepting presence built the bridge to create a young faith.

1. The actions of the people to Jesus the Christ was an exponential response to the Humble, Gentle, Accepting, Hearing, presence of Jesus in their midst.

## The expression


that says "you matter".

Practice Appreciating the Presence of Christ


Become a Charitable Listener, receive what you hear.
