The Bread and Wine of the Holy Communion are not a prize for the righteous or a reward for good behavior.


Rather they are food for the human journey and medicine for the sick. We come forward not because we are worthy but because we are all wounded and somehow unworthy.

"When you remember me do this."


Do what?


The act, the behavior, the attitude, the accepting, the trusting, etc.
