A Word From Pastor John

Acts 20:28 (NCV) "Be careful for yourselves and for all the people the Holy Spirit has given to you to oversee. You must be like shepherds to the church of God, which he bought with the death of his own son.

Well, it has certainly been an exciting and an emotional winter season so far for the United Methodist Church. As churches go through discernment journeys where some decide to move towards disaffiliation while others decide they prefer to remain with the denomination. In the information I gathered from these church proceedings, I discovered that the reaction among members of the churches ranged from passionate to oblivious. Indeed, some members have asked for an explanation of what a General Conference does? These kinds of requests and comments have prompted me to take a hard look at how Methodism is understood among the membership. Truthfully, we have life-long Methodists in our church, we have recent converts to Methodism from other denominations, and we have folks who have joined our church and have no familiarity with what Methodism is or our history. This wide range of familiarity (or unfamiliarity) presents an obstacle in a church where we operate based on certain foundational principles. My intention is to address this. I have been praying recently about a special theme we could emphasize for Lent (The five-week period before Easter) to make the season more meaningful. I had received no direction from the Lord until a little while ago. The answer came through a discussion with another pastor, that a lot of folks would benefit from a class in Methodism that explains some of our doctrine, polity and history. Therefore, (Trumpets Sounding), On the following dates: Feb 26th, March 5th, 12th, 19th, and 26th, during Sunday School time, I will be conducting the class, "All About Methodism" Each of those Sunday mornings from 9:00 am - 9:50 am in the Shomo Feagin Classroom (first room on the left in the Education Wing (room 410)..
