

A word from Pastor John

Matthew 28:1-3 (NNLT) "Early on Sunday morning, as the new day was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went out to visit the tomb. Suddenly there was a great earthquake! For an angel of the Lord came down from heaven, rolled aside the stone, and sat on it. His face shone like lightning, and his clothing was as white as snow."

I don't remember the exact date, but it was in the Spring of 1993 that I was overwhelmed by the Holy Spirit one Sunday in a little Pentecostal church in British Columbia, Canada. That afternoon I rededicated my life to Jesus and decided from that moment on I would live the rest of my days on this Earth serving the Lord. For me, that was the day the "stone was rolled away," and my reason for living was realized. I am convinced that each of us has to discover for ourselves the only thing that will fill that void in our lives, namely, a relationship with Jesus. The moment that happens is what I call the "stone rolled away" moment. Oh yes, we can try all kinds of pursuits trying to find peace and joy, hoping each new pursuit is the answer, only to find out it, too, is temporary. Indeed, when those of us on the faith journey see non-believers filled with happiness, we wonder why our road is so difficult. We don't remember that we are catching them in one of the temporary highs that come with worldly journeys. In the end, everyone realizes that there is NOTHING that can fill that void in their lives like a relationship with Jesus. This Easter, I challenge each of you to consider your faith journey. Do you really believe the resurrection story to the point where you are ready to live the rest of your life for the Lord? Can you remember your "stone rolled away" moment when you made that decision? If it is even a little foggy, I encourage you to come to kneel at the altar on Sunday (any Sunday) and rededicate your remaining days to serving the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords. Life is too short to carry that emptiness around for even one more day. It is obvious the Lord is returning soon. Let us rejoice in our Easter faith. Amen, and amen.
