A Word From Pastor John

1 Cor 1:10-12 ESV "I appeal to you, brothers, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarreling among you, my brothers. What I mean is that each one of you says, "I follow Paul," or "I follow Apollos," or "I follow Cephas," or "I follow Christ."

We seem to have gotten off track in the Christian Church. Somewhere along the way, a belief in the church surfaced that anyone who doesn't share our views is an enemy. This goes hand-in-hand with our culture that is embracing the idea that "my views are more important than your views". In addition to that, anyone who disagrees with us now is often seen as offensive and we tend to distance ourselves from them preferring to gather those around us those who are like minded. Indeed Christianity as a movement has been responsible throughout history for horrific acts of violence against people who have disagreed with the leadership of the church. This has cause splits and divisions within the church. The Apostle Paul was very specific about how important unity is in the "Body". He talks about the greatest enemy being the divisiveness among the faithful and those who perpetuate that.

Brothers and sisters, this divisiveness is also our enemy where it turns us against each other outside the church. We have political differences, religious differences and cultural differences that are threatening to erect greater barriers between God's children instead of bringing us together for dialogue. It is OK to disagree but not OK to be disagreeable! How wonderful it is to have open discussion between different points of view without attacking the other or their opinions. The "gentleness and respect" that is suggested in the above Scripture is the correct response for a Christian. Leave them thinking you are a pretty nice person even if they don't agree with you. Then you will have represented Jesus in a loving way.
