A WORD FROM PASTOR JOHN

Ecclesiastes 3:1 & 7b "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: a time to be silent and a time to speak."

Recently I was outside with my dogs late at night and there was no sound except for the distant sound of a vehicle perhaps heading home at that late hour. It was a most peaceful night. The stars were bright and beautiful. I was so overcome with a sense of calm that I whispered a prayer of thanks to God for the quiet moment. In this busy world, there doesn't seem to be a lot of time for quiet. The old adage, "Silence is Golden" doesn't just apply when your parents are saying it to you but is also an invaluable gift to oneself when a quiet moment is stolen from the din of the chaotic world.

As I watched my dogs, I realized that they communicated just fine without saying a word to each other. Couples that have been together for a long time learn this invaluable mode of interaction where a simple glance speaks volumes. We as a culture don't like silence in our interactions. Whether we are on a date or sitting with a few friends, silence is so feared that we often will invent something to say; anything rather than suffering the void of the "uncomfortable silence." Conversely, many other cultures like the Japanese have learned to appreciate silence and I have marveled as I observed older couples sitting together in a park where they had no need for words to be spoken. They're just enjoying being. In Psalm 46:10, we are instructed to "Be still and know that I am God." Remember that some of the best times you will ever spend with the Lord is when you are quiet, together, as friends neither having to weigh thoughts nor measure words.

Easter is an especially important time to be still and feel the presence of the Lord. It is a time to reflect on the importance of what it meant for Lord to give up the Life of Jesus in order to save all of us. Especially in this time of year, if we spend a little time in quiet seclusion with prayers on our hearts, we can feel the closeness of God in those moments.

As I ushered my dogs toward the door, I said from my heart, "Thank you, Lord, for Jesus. Thank you, Lord, for the quiet. I feel VERY close to you in the silence of this evening and I thank you also for making dogs that don't talk because they surely would have ruined the moment, AMEN."
